

Get out the vote in **North Dakota**

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a record-high 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

North Dakota's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

- Coronavirus updates: Counties to conduct June 9, 2020, election by mail, mail-in ballot applications sent to all voters; no announced changes for the November 3, 2020 general election.

Deadlines to know for voting in North Dakota

Voter registration deadline:

No Deadline

North Dakota does not have voter registration.

Early in-person voting deadlines:

Early in-person voting **begins 15 days before the election.**

In-person absentee voting **ends the day before the Election.**

Varies by county. Voters should contact their county elections office for additional information

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

No Deadline

No deadline; at voter's discretion

Ballot submission deadline:

In-person: Received by November 2nd, 2020.

By mail: Postmarked by November 2, 2020.

Voter ID Requirements

Voting in-person requires a

North Dakota:

- Current driver's license number or non-driver's ID card
- Tribal government issued ID or
- Long-term care ID certificate (provided by ND facility)

Identification must include the

voter's:

Name
Current residential address
Date of birth

In addition to your ID, you can supplement any missing or outdated voter info with:

- Current utility bill
- Current bank statement
- Document or check issued by a federal, state, local, or tribal government
- Paycheck
